- Dressing Up
- Karnevalszeit starts at 11.11 11:11 and ends on Rosenmontag

# Prešeren Day

- 8th February
- Death of the greatest Slovenian poet
- Cultural holiday
- Usually talk about France Prešeren in school

# Statehood day

- 25th of June
- Constitution ratified
- Speeches
- Parades
- School celebrations

# Day of Independence and Unity

- 26th of December
- The day all the votes for the plebiscite were counted
- Speeches
- Parades
- Schools celebrations

- 16th and 18th Birthday: often big birthday parties
